Role Summary

A role for teams up to 2, The Heritage Officers keep students informed of and interested in the history and legacies of the Union, and keep the Union traditions and spirit strong.

Heritage Officers have an important role in preserving the history of the Union, and the societies and other groups that form the Union. They not only run the traditional events of the Union, but work to inform students of facts they may not know about the Union, and promote the Union through its legacy, its alumni and its past accomplishments.

Responsibilities

As a Heritage Officers, you'll be responsible for maintaining the traditions of the Union and making the history of the Union known. You'll do this through:

- Researching and recording the traditions of the Unions and its societies;
- Working with the University Archivists to promote the Union and the Union through its history and legacy;
- > Organising Heritage events, and integrating Heritage into existing events;
- Helping with campaigns run by the Executive, where there may be notable alumni that can be involved or promoted;
- > Organising and maintaining historical displays within the Union space;
- Working with the University Alumni Team to keep alumni a part of St. George's, and finding new ways to integrate alumni into the activities of the Union.

Zones and Committees

Heritage Officers are part of the Union Events Zone.

The Union Events Zone is a collaborative working group, also including the Events and Charity and Volunteering Officers. Through this, you'll be working alongside other elected Officers on bigger projects and getting even more involved in the running of the Union. As a Zone, you and the other Officers will be part of designing publicity materials for events, integrating charitable fundraising into the Union's events, and planning major events like May Ball.

Skills and Abilities

As a Heritage Officer, you'll be interested in the Union and its history, and want to make sure its traditions live on. You'll have a good sense of what makes our Union special, of the George's Spirit, and what makes a difference to students during their time at University.

You'll be motivated and able to work on projects independently, as well as alongside other Offices on larger-scale endeavours. You'll be able to stay organised when running Heritage events, and will help build the interest that our Members have in the Union's traditions. You'll want the student body to be as passionate and interested in our community as you are.
