HOW THE UNION WORKS

Nobody knows quite how long St. George's Students' Union, or SGSU, has existed through its many forms. Historically known as St. George's Hospital Medical School Club, and run by the comically-named General Management Committee, or GMC, we do at least know how we work today.

SGSU's membership consists of every student and staff member at St. George's. Being a member of the Union lets you use all we have to offer - from welfare support and academic societies to sports clubs, dance studios and the Dragon bar.

The general running of the Union is done by the three sabbatical officers - we're all current or recently graduated students from St. George's taking a year out from study. We're supported by a big team of student volunteers who each have their own role. Together, we make up the Executive Committee, and we run all the events, campaigns and activities that the Union puts on throughout the year!

The Union also has permanent staff including our CEO, Office Manager, Bar and Shop Managers and Education & Welfare Support Officer, who all play a big part in ensuring the Union keeps running, not only day-to-day but from each year to the next.

Everything at the Union is overseen by the Board of Trustees, who have overall responsibility for how the Union runs and operates.

YEAR REPRESENTATIVES

As well as the students who volunteer for the Executive, some students also volunteer as Year Representatives. The Year Reps help bridge any gap between your cohort and the University - if you have any course-specific problems (concerns about assessments, feedback about teaching, issues with lectures or anything like is), your Year Rep is the best person to talk to.

The Students' Union is based on the 2nd floor of Hunter Wing. It's up here that you'll find:

- The Students' Union Main Office
- The Dragon Bar
- The Music Room
- The Alastair Hunter (AHR) and Henry Gray (HGR) Dance Studios
- The Games Room

Also up on the 2nd floor are the Boardrooms, the RAG room, the CPO store and the Welfare Room.

The Union Office is your port of call for anything and everything we can help with - all the sabbaticals are based in here. You can speak to us about clubs and societies, academic support and welfare, counselling, finances, housing, really any concerns or issues you might have.

If you ever need to get in touch with anyone from the Union, you can drop into the SU offices to meet with us - the office is usually open Monday to Friday, from 9am to 5pm. If the opening times are changed at all, this will be posted on the door and we'll update the website as well - we'll be trying to keep the office open as much as possible, but the opening times may vary depending on the ongoing social distancing policies of the Union and University.

The Dragon Bar is the Union's centre for large events. Holding up to 750 people, and with (we're led to believe) the longest Student Union bar in London, we're one of the largest venues in the Borough!

The bar offers a range of alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks, along with TVs, a free pool table,



comfortable seating and a wide programme of SU and society-led events. All the events in the bar will go up on the website event calendar, so look out for these everything from live music and dance shows to quizzes, film screenings and talks happen here!


The bar is also the home of all the Freshers events we'll be hosting in the new year, once we're all hopefully back on site and able to run them.

THE UNION SPACE

The Music Room is a practice, rehearsal and recording space for any musically-inclined students. Kitted out with two drumkits, two pianos, a range of guitars, basses and amps, it's a great space to stay musical without annoying your flatmates! If you've got your own instrument, you can also rent a locker to keep it safe in Uni. At just £30 for the year for students, you can get 24/7 access to play and practice whenever you want.

Various societies also use the Music Room for show rehearsals, musicals and live events, and there's even a weekly choir and orchestra. If you want to get involved in these, look out for info from the performing societies.

Opposite the Music Room is the Games Room, where you play pool and table tennis, as well as some extra seating and some microwaves for heating up your food. Check out the Heritage Wall in here as well!

Next door to the Music Room are the two dance studios, the AHR and HGR; with full-length dance mirrors and sound systems, they're a perfect space to learn and rehearse individually, or as part of one of the many dance groups within Uni - almost every discipline is available, from Classical, Jazz and Bollywood to modern Street, Gaana, Bhangra and more.

The AHR and HGR also get used for a massive range of events throughout the year, including weekly sports sessions like polefit and yoga, educational talks and seminars, conferences, theatre rehearsals and loads more. We've had everything in those rooms - from free lunches for the whole Union, to world-renowned surgeons, to a gigantic ballpit and even a petting zoo!

If you want to find out more about any society, look them up on the website - on there, you can find all their social media links, a mailing list sign-up and more info on what they do!






JOINING CLUBS AND SOCIETIES

While we can't hold our normal Freshers Fayre in the Union, we're doing all we can to make sure you can still find out about all the clubs and societies, follow their activity and sign up to hear more.

To see all of our clubs and societies, check the listings on our website at sgsu.org.uk/club-soc. Here, you can find the pages for all the clubs and societies that are active. If you see one that interests you, click through to their page - on here, you can see a message from the society, some info on where their activities run and their social media links - these are often the best places to keep up to date with the clubs and societies!

Clubs and societies charge subs to full members, allowing you to take part in all their activities, but you can also sign-up to be a free member - this makes sure you're on their mailing list, so they can keep you up-to-date with plans. Each club and society has its own schedule of events, and we try to list as many of these as we can on our event calendars and news posts online!

To help you connect with any clubs and societies that interest you, find out more and ask any questions you might have, we'll also be hosting a series of virtual Freshers Fayre streams with clubs and societies across two evenings over the induction period.

GEP & Paramedic Fresher Livestream date: Tuesday 1st September

Undergraduate Fresher Livestream date: Tuesday 29th September

Streams from a range of societies will run concurrently over the course of an evening, and will give you an opportunity to hear from the committees and members that make the clubs and societies what they are. If you want to find out more about a club or society, you can join their stream to discover more about their activities and benefits, as well as ask them questions.

To join in with these on the days, look out for a link from us - we'll be sending it out over email, as well as putting up on the website and on social media. A schedule for the evenings will come out a few days before the streaming date, and will show a listing of all the clubs and societies taking part along with a timetable of when they'll be live.

We'll also be hosting a Spotlight on Societies series on Facebook, Instagram and on the Website, where each day we'll be featuring our clubs or societies, sharing messages from them and inviting people to find out more.

While we can't all meet in person just yet, you'll still be able to learn as much as ever about all the fantastic activities you can take part in!



FRESHERS EVENTS

While we won't be able to host our normal Freshers schedule of events as soon as we'd all like, we'll still be hosting some events during your first weeks that you can take part in, both online and in-person.

We'll be hosting events that can still be safely held with social distancing regulations followed, like pub quizzes, in the SU bar. Entrance to these events will be ticketed - this both allows us to safely limit the number of people in the bar, and provides track and trace information.

We also will be releasing a series of events that will allow you and your new friends and flatmates to socialise, stay safe and even win prizes along the way!
